LETTER FROM COUNCILMAN TACKETT

Dear Resident of Timber Farms,

I hope this finds you safe and well as we enter the hustlebustle of the holiday season.

I would first like to extend to you and your family an invitation to the First Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony at Glasgow Park on Thursday, December 5, 2013 from 4:00

p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Please be sure to bring the kids as there will be hay rides as well as a visit from Santa Claus.

On a more solemn note, please be mindful of the fact that crime spikes at this time of year. Opportunistic thieves are keeping a watchful eye on our vehicles, sheds and homes in an effort to accumulate goods and extra cash.

The New Castle County Chief of Police has enacted a new predictive policing program entitled "TAPS" (Targeted Analytical Policing System). Recognizing that most criminal activity is not comprised of the more serious offenses (robberies, assaults, murders, etc.), police are focusing attention on those incidents most frequently reported by citizens and often characterized as "Quality of Life" calls for police service. Examples of such calls include reports of disorderly subjects, speeding cars, loud radios, suspicious persons or vehicles, fights, people loitering on street corners and reported drug dealing. If these smaller issues go unchecked, it is believed that they grow into the more serious crimes.

Colonel Setting also realizes that if efforts are not made to suppress or prevent crime from occurring, the police officers on the street will continue to be reactive and spend the majority of time responding to 911 calls instead of patrolling and interacting with communities in assigned areas.

The goal is to persuade County residents to call 911 when witnessing "Quality of Life" incidents. This provides stability and well-being in communities as residents are alert and taking an active part in combining their efforts with police and minimizing crime in their own neighborhoods.

Thank you in advance for your assistance with this effort. Please remain aware and ever vigilant. Never let your guard down. Criminals are waiting to take advantage of a time and place when folks are the most vulnerable. Always park in a well-lighted parking lots and always lock your car doors when exiting or entering your vehicle.

Your family's safety is a major concern for my office. Please know that I remain available and accessible to discuss issues of importance to you and your family.




