# INFORMATION FROM SENATOR TOWNSEND & REP. MADINAH WILSON-ANTON

We hope you are well as the summer months begin and we transition to the state's most significant move toward reopening the economy since the start of the pandemic. There are a few topics we would like to address briefly here. Our contact information is below, and we welcome emails and phone calls if you have any feedback or questions.

NEW ALL-WAY STOP IN TIMBER FARMS: DelDOT recently approved our request to create a new all-way stop at the intersection of Timber Wood Blvd. and W. Hummock Lane/Woodland Road. This request is the result of concerns about speeding in the area which we've heard from many residents. DelDOT's next steps are to finalize the necessary traffic regulatory resolutions to authorize the all-way stop and to install new stop signs at the intersection.

DRAINAGE ISSUES: In the recent months, we have received an influx of drainage issues from constituents in the district. These drainage issues range from mild to severe, and are either in the jurisdiction of DelDOT or the New Castle County Conservation District. We have been working diligently to get these resolved to provide relief in your homes and communities. Please reach out to us if you need drainage assistance.

COVID-19: The State of Delaware has taken great strides in providing resources to aid in slowing down the spread of corona virus. We extend our sincerest condolences to those who have lost family members to COVID-19, including right here in Timber Farms, or have experienced other health consequences. TIMBER FARMS MAINTENANCE CORPORATION

It is now a few weeks since the deadline for paying the maintenance assessments has passed, and we are happy to report that most of you have remitted the assessment. Thank you very much. If you have not done so, please send the payment as soon as possible. Late fees will be charged, and legal enforcement costs will raise the amount you owe considerably. Contact any of the Board members if you should have questions regarding your assessment. The funds that we collect allow us to pay for such items as grass cutting, tree work and landscaping. As you surely saw when exiting or entering our development, flowers were planted on the islands at the entrance and on our berm along Old Baltimore Pike where they spell out the name of our development. This was the creative idea and work of Timber Farms resident Timon Cartwright who has been doing landscaping work for us since last year. Timon has also done some tree work, but for larger jobs, we had to hire a tree removal company. Recently, a number of trees on our open spaces adjacent to residents properties have died due to root damage and changes in drainage after the construction of homes. We have budgeted

funds for this type of work, but we hope that not to many additional trees will die or be uprooted during storms.

The vote on the speed bump on Timber Farms Blvd was close, but in the end, there was insufficient support for it. The Board hopes that even in the absence of a speed bump, residents will obey the speed limit within the development of 25 mph. Driving through the development at 35 or 45 mph will only get you home a few seconds earlier and it is not worth the risk of injuring someone.

The Board would also like to remind residents that approval is needed for additions, fences, and sheds before work is started or items are purchased. In this way, deed restriction violations can be avoided. Please also remember that our deed restrictions forbid overnight parking on the street as well as parking trailers or boats in driveways.
